School Site Council, ELAC & PTSA

Three groups that guide and support Hiram Johnson High School will begin meeting for the new year.

School Site Council works with the school to develop budgets, guide plans and evaluate measures of success. It works to develop the Site Plan for Student Achievement (SPSA). The SPSA lays out objective goals and funds resources and investments that are identified as critical to reaching the identified goal.

Goals for this year at HJHS listed in the SPSA are:

- 1) % of students completing Integrated Math 1 with a C or better
- 2) % of English Learners that improve a level on the ELPAC

assessment test

- 3) % of students graduating College & career prepared
% of students graduating College & career prepared.
- 4) Responses to the Campus Climate Survey.

The ELAC group works to ensure English Learners have the resources they need to be successful. HJHS has invested in a class-size reduction plan to provide the attention these students deserve.

The PTSA meets next week to support the school-wide programs. The PTSA sponsored the Panda Express fundraiser and has another planned for November.

Kagan intends to increase engagement

Teachers just finished the 3 round of Kagan Structures training which provided teachers with specific strategies to increase student engagement. While authentic participation is always a goal for teachers, it is even more challenging during distance learning.

The Kagan structures create groupings and processes that are named and allow both teachers and

students to become accustomed to the groupings and routines. The automaticity developed allows for more effective and efficient teacher/student interactions.

The Hiram Johnson faculty has now completed the first 3 phases of the trainings and will finish the fourth in February with Will C. Wood Middle School as we continue to develop our articulation process.

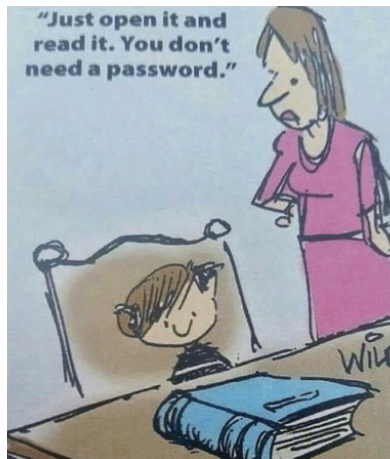

Here is a reminder of the process for Behavior Referrals:

1. Staff Knowledge: Please add the restrictions on your zoom meetings as follows:
 - a. Allow students in one at a time.

- a. Uncheck the option that allows students to change their names
 - b. Uncheck the option that allows students to unmute themselves
 - c. Under the option "annotations" remove the ability for students to annotate. This is how they draw on the screen. [\(see video\)](#)
 - Require students to authenticate themselves
1. Put the student in the waiting room for a conversation
 2. If applicable give them another opportunity to improve their behavior.
 3. Contact home if the behavior does not improve and document in the contact log. [\(see video\)](#)
 4. Email Mr. Charles Love and Ms. Bucio to inform the Climate office that there was a contact log entry.
 5. Administrative Resolution

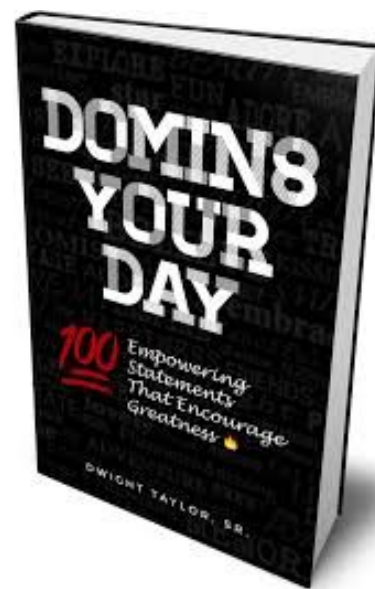
