<ul> <li>These recommendations are ELD teachers for separate sections (ELD 1 and 2), additional bilingual instructional assistants for Spanish and other languages with highest needs in Spanish, followed by Hmong, Cantonese, Vietnamese and Mien.</li> <li>Professional development for the Math department and other departments that would show best practices specifically for English learners.</li> <li>Having peer tutors and mentors for English learner students.</li> <li>0 and 7<sup>th</sup> period options for academic support.</li> <li>Long term English learners placed in gen. ed. classes with support as needed.</li> <li>These are some of the highlights of the recommendations.</li> </ul>

<ul> <li>No updates. Meeting this Wed. at 5:30pm.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>ASB -</li> <li>Currently we are preparing the school for hybrid transfer.</li> <li>Working on decorating the bulletin boards for old spirit days and old events so students can see how our school was before.</li> <li>We also are adding some mental health awareness and COVID related materials to the bulletin boards.</li> <li>We are also planning for next year and planning for a Johnson's America's Got Talent that would probably be live on Zoom.</li> </ul>

<ul> <li>We are getting ready to return to campus. It is all hands on deck in helping with the school opening.</li> </ul>



Ada	<ul> <li>The Sac County office of Mental Health therapist is returning.</li> <li>We will have 2 university interns returning to the campus when school reopens. Social work interns for next school year will be selected beginning in June.</li> <li>Any student and/or caregiver can self-refer for Support Center services. If students have friends interested in support, they can contact us. We advertise our cell numbers and how to reach us on our school website. We also have our Google website that is specific for our support center.</li> <li>We have been busy doing a lot of crisis intervention.</li> <li>min –</li> <li>April 22<sup>nd</sup>, school reopens for hybrid learning. We have cohort technology support teachers assisting in getting the rooms ready with new technology for school opening.</li> <li>School day schedule will change to start at 9:00am across the board starting on April 22<sup>nd</sup> and end at 12:20pm for in-person synchronous learning.</li> <li>We will have an opportunity for students to come on campus tomorrow to get help in applying for scholarships and filling out their FAFSA applications.</li> <li>We are still looking at the grades of our students with the COVID floor of 50% and we are still looking at how we can help our students out. We are planning on having credit recovery for the summertime for those students who need it.</li> <li>Ethnic Studies – it is a semester class for Freshmen. We are having Mr. Singley teaches a class for upperclassmen who missed the class or did not get to take the class as a Freshman.</li> </ul>
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		• Scholarships are available but will need to get the word out to students as application submission this year was very low. This is happening across the high schools in the district. Low scholarship submissions are largely due to COVID related issues. Some of the scholarship deadlines are being extended to encourage more applicants.

	Presentation by BSU -Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) Assistance		<ul> <li>council.</li> <li>The origin of the survey came from an article about the suspension rate of black students compared to others. The purpose is to bring about discussions about black students' experiences in class discipline and bring data to support student feelings and perceptions about class discipline.</li> <li>The survey consists of 35 questions and statements concerning HJHS disciplinary habits and treatments of students from all backgrounds.</li> <li>We received about 400 survey responses.</li> <li>The results of the survey rank Black students very low across all questions.</li> <li>As a result of this survey, BSU would like: <ul> <li>The school has anti-bias training for all staff.</li> <li>Bi-annual meeting with BSU board and school admin.</li> <li>Better promotion of community meetings.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

Make this an A-G course requirement.</li> <li>o Accountability check-ins.</li> <li>o Equitable school wide discipline.</li> </ul> For the budget spending: <ul> <li>As we are discussing coming back to school, we have found that we have even more need for some electronics.</li> <li>We have purchased some additional touchscreen panels to make sure that every classroom including PE has those.</li> <li>We have ordered an additional 25 laptops for teachers. This is in addition to what we have already previously purchased. As we purchased more Apple computers, we also had to purchase additional adapters to go with these Apple computers. <ul> <li>We were able to get some student swags and water bottles for students because water fountains on campus are closed due to COVID.</li> </ul></li></ul>
			<ul> <li>3,000 more to distribute to students next year.</li> <li>We also need to order additional projectors for those teachers who are still using projectors in addition to the flat panel monitors.</li> <li>Technology spending is up to about 81% so far.</li> <li>We are spending down the money as the council approves, by the proposed percentages.</li> <li>For school safety – we purchased an updated desktop to support our video systems and added more memory to the computers.</li> </ul>

<ul> <li>CSI -</li> <li>CSI is Comprehensive Support and Improvement which is money allocated to the school right before we went on Spring break.</li> <li>This is another injection of funds that we need to find priorities for.</li> <li>We qualify for this grant based on our performance on the five California Dashboard with a combination of "red" status indicators.</li> <li>Based on the 2019 dashboard, we are "Red" in suspension, "Red" in English language arts proficiency and "Red" in math. That is three "Reds" out of five. We qualify for the grant by having the majority of our indicators in "Red" status.</li> <li>Some requirements for the program include spending that has to align with the comprehensive needs of our school. It has to align with the district LCAP and has to be included in our SPSA and goals. It also needs to align with how we will improve our dephered indicators.</li> </ul>

We cannot use the grant to hire additional permanent staff, purchase of furniture, food or space, purchase of equipment for administrative or personal use and supplanting of existing funds.
<ul> <li>We also cannot use the grant for purchasing promotional materials, journal subscriptions, travel outside of the US,</li> </ul>
and payment for professional memberships or purchase or upgrade of any machine, land or facilities.
<ul> <li>How we use CSI funds needs to be approved by the School Site Council and the Board of Education.</li> </ul>



		<ul> <li>With the CSI funds, we plan to reallocate some of our spending to CSI that qualifies for CSI which would free up other funds to cover spending that is not allowed in CSI.</li> <li>Ms. Rubert motioned to extend the meeting to another 15 minutes to 5:45pm. Second by Mr. Shaw.</li> </ul>
