PDSA, Data Based Decisions top WASC report

Plans for Hiram Johnson's WASC visit in March are underway and much of the information will flow through department chairs, school site council and the PTSA. Because of the possibility it will be conducted virtually, much of the evaluation will be centered on the self-report the school submits in January.

After Hiram Johnson's successful probationary WASC visit went well last year, the reports compiled by both the school and the visiting committee laid out and endorsed a plan forward for the school.

The Plan, Do, Study, Act process for teacher collaboration, data-based decisions, counselor impact, increased CTE opportunities and community engagement are called out in the reports. Evidence collected will be reviewed to determine if it demonstrates coherence or effectiveness of the plan.

The PDSA cycle is specifically highlighted along with the resulting data-based decisions. The report states that our teaching teams select a curricular standard, PLAN a lesson and identify the artifact that would demonstrate student proficiency or mastery. Each team member would DO the lesson in the next week. After teachers implement lesson and compile artifacts and STUDY data on proficiency or mastery. At the next meeting results are compared and trends are identified. Questions are asked and and plans are made to ACT.

In order for our school to receive the evaluation report our students deserve, we will need evidence that this process is conducted with fidelity and that resulting plans are made on the based on data.

The school will continue to support the counseling office as it continues to look for ways to impact student success. The Cash for College program is a huge success. The graduation and FAFSA completion rate were increased.

Career Technical Education is back on campus in terms of organizational structure. Last year budgets and meetings for CTE teachers were controlled by the district office and with new leadership there, the local control has been returned.

We will continue to work on parent engagement. With that in mind, we must support those who support Hiram Johnson High School. Our PTSA has had two fundraising events that net the school dollars. We can do better. Mr. Vasquez is a committed parent and deserves our support. Our next opportunity is December 7 at Panda Express on Folsom Blvd. All you have to do is buy dinner and have a flyer and the school gets its percentage!

We have this in front of us. We can make this year's visit as successful as last years. We owe our students.


Workability Drive-Thru Fair

CLIMATE & CULTURE

SEL Theme: GRATITUDE

"When teaching about gratitude in a school setting, it is important to keep in mind that students differ in terms of culture, race, socioeconomic status, and religious background. This may mean that they also differ in the way they express and practice gratitude, including verbal expressions, gestures, acts of kindness or caring, rituals, or gifts. Welcoming discussion of these and other differences in the classroom will deepen students' understanding of gratitude.

In addition, the experience of gratitude may be challenging for children facing personal struggles, community suffering, or systemic inequality. Rather than simply encouraging them to "look on the bright side," researchers Jeffrey Froh and Giacomo Bono suggest listening deeply, empathizing, and acknowledging their feelings. This can help them cultivate resilience, which—along with other qualities like self-compassion and hope—could help plant the seeds for gratefulness." <u>Greater Good</u> <u>Science Center</u>
