

CRIMINAL JUSTICE CAREERS



Police Officer– The local governmental department charged with the protection and control of the community,

Correctional Officer– is a person charged with the responsibility of the supervision, safety and security of prisoners in a prison, jail, or similar form of secure custody

Probation/Parole Officer– an officer of a court who supervises offenders placed on probation/parole and assists them to reenter society as a positive citizen.

Prosecuting Attorney– A lawyer empowered to prosecute cases on behalf of a government and its people.

Defense Attorney– the lawyer representing the defendant, authorized to practice law; conducts lawsuits or gives legal advice

Federal Agent– any federal law-enforcement officer (ex. FBI, CIA, US Marshalls)

Highway Patrol Officer– A state law enforcement organization whose police officers patrol the public highways

Crime Scene Investigator– A specialist in the collection and examination of the physical evidence of crime


"We Are Family Here"

About US—Sacramento Police Department Magnet Academy

In the fall of 1990, the birth of the Criminal Justice and Public Service Academy in Sacramento began with one school and just over 30 cadets. Today, our program has exploded into one of the most successful Magnet programs in Northern California. The unique partnership between the Sacramento City Police Department, the Sacramento City Unified School District, the Twin Rivers Unified School District and the California Partnership Academies has pushed the program to new heights with over 430 cadets spread out among four area high schools. The success of our program was made possible through the support from The Sacramento Police Foundation as well as from many other private organizations that dedicated themselves to serving the needs and aspirations of our cadets. As Sacramento Police Chief Rick Brazier proclaimed: "Partnerships are the backbone of the Criminal Justice Magnet School Program's success."

ACADEMY REQUIREMENTS

Cadets who enter the Criminal Justice Academy agree to uphold its high standards. Cadets are required to perform 50 hours of community service per year, maintain a 2.0 GPA, adhere to a specific grooming standard, wear an academy uniform once a week, maintain an 80 percent attendance rate and earn 90 percent of their credit requirements for graduation.
